
A GRAND REOPENING

When it opened on Broadway in 1994, critics were wildly enthusiastic and it was nominated for two Tony Awards, including Best Musical. Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II may Rodgers and Hammerstein remain.

Our production will be directed by a Goodspeed favorite—Rob Ruggiero (*Show Boat, Carousel, Fiddler on the Roof*) who no doubt will make this a bright, fun and joyful evening for all of us. Choreography will be provided by Lainie Sakakura.

We're sure Goodspeed Members will be as happy as we are to see the "grand old lady" all lit up for another opening night. In the words of Donna Lynn Hilton, Artistic Director and Goodspeed staff member for over 35 years, "Goodspeed is back and it's time to celebrate!" She and Managing Director David Byrd look forward to seeing all of you at the bottom the stairs after the show.
